Dear Friends,

Dear friends, February 2021 In February we approach Lent. Lent is a period of 40 days in the Christian Calendar and a time for reflection and preparation for Easter. It is associated with an introspective moment for repentance and penitence. For Christians we seek to replicate Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days and this, recalling the wanderings of the Israelites for forty years in the wilderness.

Well, already this year you may have had your unexpected fill of more withdrawal and aimless wanderings for exercise. Time in the wilderness! Further lockdown!

But can it be said too often, that whilst the withdrawal from one another and into our home for long periods has been challenging at best and debilitating for many, we have enjoyed some shoots of new life. There are some gifts. Have I not mentioned before evidence of greater neighborliness, increased involvement in local voluntary projects, the new appreciation of health service workers and recognition of our interdependence on one another with local service provision and all these folk do on our behalf. Has there not been an understanding of our impact on the environment when we are finally required to travel less. And maybe some time to get to know ourselves again.

One of our gifts in our pastorate, has been our continued fellowship and meeting for live worship on the telephone and online. Our three churches have continued to meet together to share communion (if not the bread and wine), prayer scripture and song, (if not aloud) and worship the God who gives us life and to encourage one another, to laugh and comfort one another, and together seek Gods Spirit to enliven and impact our lives, through Christ.

Covid has kept us apart. But Christ keeps us as one. *"I am the vine, and you are the branches..." John 15:5.*

It is encouraging that we have been meeting together with up to 60 or 70 others including those from out of "state" and Mary and Sue and friends from Surbiton Care Home. It is lovey to think we can still meet and join together as one. We can all be encouraged.

So, perhaps this is a reminder that Lent is also a time to see the world afresh. As well as reflecting on ourselves, warts and all, may we also recognize the nature and purposes of God and the never-ending renewal of possibility within ourselves and the world. This, from being together, even alone in the wilderness.

We have found this in our live morning worship together. So, I am now inviting you to join online or on the telephone each week during Lent for a short bible study and reflection. The reflection will be based on the booklet and material "Holy Habits" by Andrew Roberts.

Walking the Way, Living the life of Jesus today is the current United Reformed Church focus on encouraging a celebration and exploration about what it means to empower people to be the presence of Jesus through our everyday lives, across the denomination and beyond.

Holy Habits, Following Jesus is a recommended resource taking participants on a journey looking at Holy Habits in the life and passion of Jesus. We are providing some family resources to include the younger folk and following the Holy Habits Lent material and a weekly reflection.

If you would like to join in these reflections each week there will be two opportunities for a 30-45 minute session, using the same links for the telephone and online as we do for worship. We will share a moment of worship, prayer and scripture reading, questions and conversation on each reading.

So please join us either;

On **Wednesdays from 17th February at 6.30pm** or on **Thursday 18th February** from at 3pm for a Lent experience as a pastorate. (see below)

Lent is a moment for repentance and penitence. But together with God, there are still many opportunities, especially in the wilderness to see the world afresh.

Secretary's Report for 2020

2020 was a year like no other! It started off normally although there were rumours of a virus in China but we never thought it would reach us here. We soon realised how different life would become. By March all places of worship had to close and everything was shut down. No-one used our halls, so Roger was approached by the Foodbank who asked if they could use the Raeburn Hall as a centre for distributing food parcels to those who were shielding. Food was delivered to the church and packed into boxes by volunteers, then more volunteers, among them Roger, our Minister, came to deliver the boxes to people in our area. This continued until June when Kids United were due to return to use the Raeburn Hall. The operation then moved into the Church sanctuary with a one way system operating for those entering and leaving. This continued until Churches could open again for private prayer. It took a lot of organising before we could return.

During the months when we could not worship in Church, Roger organised telephone services each Sunday morning for the people from Epsom, Ewell and Tolworth Churches to join in. The Foodbank moved out and we opened the Church for private prayer twice a week. Not many people came but it gave us the opportunity to talk to people who were passing by and let them know who we are.

Roger spent a great deal of time on risk assessment before we could open again for worship. We had to have hand sanitisers and spaced out seating and a new cleaning regime for the halls and church. He also had WiFi installed so that those who had the technology could watch the services on screen as well as telephone.

The Elders then agreed to open the Church for Sunday worship on Harvest Sunday 27th September. We did not have the usual food and flower display but had a food collection for the Foodbank. Thank you to all who contributed, We then had services for a few weeks with a limit of 30 people attending until November when we all went back into lockdown again.

Christmas was approaching and we tried to make plans. We were allowed back at the beginning of December and managed to have a tree lighting service and had the church decorated with lots of stars made by members of the congregation. After two services in December, the virus was spreading rapidly and we were advised to stay at home. The Elders decided to cease worship in Church once again but to continue with online and telephone services. And so ended 2020!

Throughout this trying year we tried to keep in touch with everyone, especially those housebound or shielding. It has been a difficult year but now we have the vaccine which several of our members have already had, so perhaps the end is in sight. During this strange time our Minister, Roger, has worked ceaselessly. He has kept us going with online services, he has delivered food parcels, opened the Church for prayer and always been there for anyone who needed him. He has moved chairs and set out the Church for the new style of worship, helped decorate the Church for Christmas, kept in touch with members and worked to get more people to hire the halls when they could be used. For a short time we had a ladies choir using the church each week for practices and a couple of other groups using the Elgar Hall. Sadly, all this ceased when we went into lockdown again in November. We have had very little income from halls lettings

during 2020, only Kids United have managed to keep going so our income has been greatly depleted.

We pray that things will improve in 2021 and we will eventually return to normal worship. Thank you to all those who have helped – the elders for their support, those who stewarded when we opened for prayer, those who helped decorate the Church for Christmas and everyone who joined in online worship. Perhaps things will never be the same again but one thing will never change and that's God's Love for us all.
