From our Minister

Dear Friends, January 2022

"Can anything good come from Nazareth?"

And so, it is we begin 2022 without one of the greatest religious leaders of modern times. We remember the life and mourn the loss of Archbishop Desmond Tutu whose funeral is on the first day of the New Year. Small in stature with an infectious, strange laugh and the South African man-shuffle when he danced, he was of course a giant! A giant campaigner and activist against the hideous apartheid regime of South Africa. A giant participant and chair of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission among South Africa's new leadership; a commission housed in the Constitutional Court, built from the bricks of the Johannesburg prison (which had held women and men political prisoners, in segregated cells, (non-white prisoners in dormitories) as well anti-apartheid activists including Nelson Mandela and at one stage Gandhi.

About Desmond Tutu, the president of South Africa President Ramaphosa said. "From the pavements of resistance in South Africa to the pulpits of the world's great cathedrals and places of worship, and the prestigious setting of the Nobel peace prize ceremony, the Arch distinguished himself as a non-sectarian, inclusive champion of universal human rights."

Desmond Tutu was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1984 and his ministry as an Anglican cleric and influence was world-wide. I like to think of an association with the bishop in my own theological studies in Oxford. When asked my degree mark I say I achieved a "desmond!" that is a 2:2! But more importantly it was here I read his book The Rainbow People of God. Tutu's writings and speeches culled from historic moments of the South African people's struggle he speaks of a celebration of all Gods diversity; "ALL" being God's people, regardless of skin colour of course, but also background and culture, wealth, sexuality, religion, or gender. A recent newspaper article following his death stated that he did not live to see his rainbow people fulfilled. Not strictly true. God's people are already a rainbow people of difference. Tutu's call was for us live as a rainbow people of God, a celebration of Gods difference, all redeemed by Christ. In this sense it is an ongoing living movement.

And so it is, an angel visits a room in a small insignificant town, Nazareth where God is proclaimed to be with us; in a brave very young girl; in a hesitant impending step-father; in the welcome of poor shepherds and strange far away visitors; in a lesser known little village Bethlehem; in a grubby smelly animal shed; in two aged folk in a synagogue; in the escape of a refugee family; in their return to live as a working carpenter family in the insignificant town where it is soon to be said, "can anything good come from Nazareth? (John1;46).

Whist in South Africa Gillian and I visited the Number Four prison in Johannesburg and the constitutional on the same site. We also walked down Vilakazi Street in Soweto, the South African township (now a tourist attraction). These districts were the underdeveloped segregated areas reserved for non-white communities. Even in the years since the ending of apartheid in 1994 such areas are far from described as economically thriving. But during the struggles theses townships lacked basic amenities. The quality of life and social conditions were abysmal. "Can anything good come from Soweto"?

Both Nelson Mandela and Archbishop Desmond Tutu lived in Vilakazi Street. And so, Vilakazi Street in Soweto Township is the only street in the world that has been home to two Noble Peace Prize winners.

"Can anything good come from Soweto"? "Can anything good come from Nazareth? (John1;46).

In <u>our</u> small places; streets and homes; churches and prayers; efforts and failures; dancing and shuffling; God is present as God was present in the child Christ. May we live as the Rainbow People of God and discover God with us again in and throughout 2022.

Well this year has been a very strange year hasn't it?

I was locked down with 4 other lovely people Chris and Bill also Bernard and Joan. We all live in the same block of apartments, so every day we did things together: We walked Ross across the beaches every day. we went in swimming, we cooked and ate together and watched TV series in the evenings.

Our best venture is that we were interested in the allotments - the land bought by a wonderful man called Patrick and after looking for it many times we found it one morning in January and Patrick was there and low and behold there were two plots available and we chose the slightly smaller of the two-called plot M We then had a meeting together and we decided to have sectioned off slightly raised beds which a young gardener called Tom made for us (cheating a bit) We had many a discussion as to what to put in them don't laugh our first purchase was 2 benches in which to keep our tools naively we thought we would have plenty of time to sit on them and admire the wonderful views of the Havens as it was the top plot on high ground..... oh no we were much too busy for that (in fact any relation that dared show their faces here were taken up there and given a job). We were so lucky that Sian, Babs daughter, delivered to us about ten sacks of matured horse manure which really helped our crops . Our biggest joy was when we dud up our first potatoes - potato after potato came up from one plant amid cheers that could be heard in the village, which were delicious cooked later that day with lashings of Welsh butter (James Martin would be proud of us) We were helped by advice from all the more experienced allotment keepers and Terry Walton's book which helped us week by week as to what we should be doing !!! - not always accomplished but we did try !!!

Our many successes besides early potatoes were Maris Piper potatoes; beetroot; peas; onions; carrots; lettuce - our failures were Cabbages - attacked by whitefly and beans attacked by the wind.


