



From our Minister

Dear friends,

Easter is now over. We have rehearsed, reflected, reimagined, and relived the story of Jesus whom we seek to follow during his final days on earth. All his hurts and pains, disappointments, betrayals, and his horrors. Some we relive ourselves. Some we can see in the pains of others. Some we can just imagine. But the glorious story is that the physical things that confined and defined Jesus earthly life are not the things we cling to either. For there is resurrection. Hallelujah?



Now we face the hurts and deaths and resurrections without Jesus' physical body among us because in May we remember his ascension. In Acts chapter one, following the gospel accounts we hear how the disciples stood "intently" looking into the sky as Jesus was taken up before their very eyes. This is our challenge. We know Jesus had to be taken up. How else could the Spirit of God in Jesus be released for us all. How else could the world know of all he had done. How else could the Spirit of God continue Jesus' work on earth in us.

I was encouraged to watch a Netflix film recently. Yes Netflix. How modern am I? The film is called "Don't Look Up". The film had an Oscar winning director and an all-star cast. The film is a dark comedy but promoted as "based on truly possible true events."

In the film two scientists discover a "planet killing" comet hurtling towards earth. They attempt to alert the people, the government, the world! Despite their warnings the dangers go unheeded by a distracted world. The president is focused on winning her mid term elections, "let's sit tight and assess", she decides. The media are concerned about ratings focus on the latest celebrity split! A billionaire is focused on the quick buck tries to mine the comet for precious metals. The public squabble about whether it even exists.

The meteor, a thinly vailed metaphor for the climate crisis, isn't taken seriously. People in the film are told "not to look up" at the pending disaster coming.

Although inverted, "...why do you stand looking up toward heaven...? is a similar message for ascension.

Can we look to Jesus, the lovely bits of story, the nice words and the treasures in heaven and miss the warnings for us here on Earth? Gods own creation.

Climate change, suggested by the film is one such challenge remembering God's love for all creation. Let's not be looking up toward heaven and miss how God's earth is being treated.

In the Netflix film, Don't Look Up people seemed more concerned with the celebrity and ratings than what was going on around them. Not only the planet killing comet, but the day to day lives and hopes of one another. Let's not be looking up toward heaven and miss opportunities to reach out to a lonely neighbour or hurting friend as well as opportunity to reduce our carbon footprint.

Ascension, as Jesus is taken from the earth, is not a time to look heavenward. Not up or down, but around. We are called again to be present in the world and alert in the world and prayerfully consider our contribution to justice and love where we are.

Sometimes, comet or not the difference might be world changing.

Following 2020, 2021 had its own difficulties, with Covid-19 still around but hopefully coming to an end. Church services resumed, but in a more spaced out way. Freewill offerings increased by a little over £2,000, but halls lettings were down by £4,600. Freewill offerings have been in the £15,000's, but that was some 10 years ago when there were a few more in the congregation. The overall deficit in the Receipts and Expenditure account was £2,948, just £150 down on the previous year.

We spent the remaining £976 in respect of the Synod grant of £8,000in our Fundraising account, and there is now £8,000 in our Fundraising account to cover the further amount that we are asked to spend on Church work and mission.

We did have a Gift Day in 2021, when £2,245 was raised. As discussion on which charities to support was delayed it was decided to make these donations in 2022. Once again our reserves in the Deposit Fund remained unchanged,

Finally, I must express my thanks to the Halls Letting Officer, the Property Steward and his assistants, the Examiner of the accounts and the typist, and my appreciation for all they do.
